








#### **Goal II: Advocacy and Public Image**



Due to the time off to recover from the hurricane, we missed celebrating National School Lunch Week in October, so we held our own celebration in November, wearing our Peace, Love and School Lunch T-shirts and decorating our serving lines and food courts with 60's-themed items.

Our SNACC group, the School Nutrition Association of Charlotte County for professional development, has been challenged to schedule a meeting this school year. We welcomed Diane Colon and Jackie Yang (a local graduate!) from BMO Bank and they gave many tips on how to make your money work for you.
